- The characteristics of the researchers that may affect the research during data collection should be defined and adequately explained,
- The sampling procedures should be described in sufficient detail,
- Validity and reliability should be discussed,
- Findings should be placed in the context of relevant literature, and alternative interpretations should be considered when needed,
- Tables or graphs of the findings should be added under the findings part.
- Fair conclusion without sufficient justification from the evidence presented,
- The discussion part should be added,
