I am thankful for the opportunity to review this paper entitled "Review prosody, punctuation, and dyslexia: Implication for the use of speech technologies.". I appreciate how the author reviewed varied pertinent papers of the existing literature. I believe this manuscript has a potential contribution to the field, however there are many points that need to be developed, as summarized by other reviewers.

From my side, I add few suggestions for improvement:

- 1. I consider a problem the lack of a formal structure of a review paper. Therefore, the manuscript needs a more formal structure with description of: researchable question, databases and key-words, criteria for evaluating the paper's quality, type of literature included in the review, the method of interpretation, and results;
- 2. I recommend you present a more detailed theoretical review of dyslexia considering definitions, types/sub-types, etiology, and symptomatology, and of elements of prosody;
- 3. Consider discussing the implications of your study for teachers and researchers; and how this work improve knowledge on the prosodic processing in dyslexia;
