- The instruments are not mentioned in the abstract.
- Time of the study must be mentioned in abstract.
- "Employee well-being" is a variable that mentioned in aim but it is not in Title.
- There is no implication for nurses and other health providers in the abstract section.

Introduction

- The statistic of safety clime should be added in introduction
- · Give a definition of safety climate
- In the introduction section, the context of this study (Pakistan) should be explained.
- Explain about transactional leadership and transformational leadership.
- Give a definition of transactional leadership and transformational leadership.

Methods

- The research methods are not described clearly.
- The "cross-sectional study" must be added in methods.
- Time of the study must be mentioned.
- · The instruments should be explained completely.
- Testing the reliability of instruments must be explained in details.
- Data gathering from nurses must be explained completely (Which shifts? Who delivered and collected the



questionnaires...

• 'Convenience' samples are of little use statistically as one cannot be generalised to the wider research population. The limitations of your sample should be considered in both the Discussion and Limitations sections.

Discussion

- The authors must interpret their findings them in context of previous work
- In the discussion, the unique aspects of this study should be explored.
