The author presents a unique nexus of Anthropocene effect on the Kali Eagles proliferated by COVID19. However, the paper has limitations that can be improved further:

- The abstract lacks the exact findings rather generalized narration. Incorporation of findings and summary methodology is salient to improve the draft.
- The method is presented as "results & discussion" the author tend to pre-empt the findings before pinning the discussion. An example "At the time of maximal sightings, the Kali was seen sunning on a ridge near the Baroro delta that is tucked in between human settlements and farms. On 22 January 2022, a brood of eighteen (18) Kali individuals was seen on this ridge. For the recording period, this was the greatest number of Kali individuals sighted in the area." The methodology should present the indicative research process rather forthwith findings. This statement negates the reader to discussion rather methodology.
- Presented analytical data in the method sub-section should be presented as discussion or findings rather as a method.
- The references are so limiting. The author should explore & utilize more citations from other scholars.
- The discussion is too brief unlike compared to the method. More findings & discussions could elucidate for this
 interesting study.
