

Review of: "Choosing Education Abroad: A Parental Perspective in China"

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This topic is quite intriguing. However, from the content of the article, it is rather disappointing. Firstly, in the introduction, the author fails to establish the research value, methodology, and significance of this topic. The author only provides a brief two-sentence introduction to the introduction section. Secondly, the paper lacks a proper research design; instead, it relies solely on the author's subjective presentation of parental concerns regarding sending their children abroad for study. This approach is overly subjective, and the supporting literature appears too simplistic and arbitrary. Finally, the results analysis and discussion section of this study is notably deficient. It fails to engage in a targeted exploration based on previous relevant research and theories.
