This article is written on an important topic that occupies a significant place in the daily practice of allergists, internists, dermatologists, and even emergency physicians. This narrative review article is generally well-written, explains clearly what adverse drug reactions (ADRs) are, and highlights certain ADRs which sometimes lead to severe complications resulting in death. Furthermore, the manuscript flourished with good-quality images. However, I have some recommendations for the authors:

- 1-The English style should be improved, and grammatical and typing errors should be corrected.
- 2-Acute generalized exanthematous pustulosis (AGEP) should be mentioned in the text.
- 3-It would be great to mention treatments of ADRs briefly.
- 4-Monoclonal antibodies have also been associated with leukocytoclastic vasculitis. This information should be mentioned in the corresponding section. (reference: Fraticelli P, Benfaremo D, Gabrielli A (2021) Diagnosis and management of leukocytoclastic vasculitis. Intern Emerg Med;16:831-841.)
- 5-The role of RegiSCAR scoring in the diagnosis of DRESS syndrome should be mentioned.
- 6-Tales, for example, risk factors for Stevens Johnson syndrome should be referenced in the text.
- 7-It would be great to provide an image of DRESS syndrome (demonstrating the characteristic maculopapular rash and facial edema)
- 8-The DRESS syndrome section should be separated from the following section to make the text clearer.

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
