- 6. what scale was used to measure the professional activities
- 7. what scale was used to measure the lives of nurses.... all these are not clear
- 8. Simple description of information....interpretation and finding the new knowledge not evident
- 9. How sample selected?
- 10. what is the sample size? How sample size is calculated? these need to be added in the methods
- 11. Results are explained only with frequency and percentage....not used other inferential statistics
- 12. Not mentioned about limitations and recommendation of the study
- 13. In conclusion it is mentioned that Nurses who were afraid of death due to COVID-19 needed more psychological support in proportion to the severity of their symptoms, how this inference is drawn?
- 14. No valid and reliable tools are used to measure the variable
- 15. Conclusion is not related to aim of the study
