The paper presents a clear attempt to redefine the concept of e-Government, offering a well-thought-out framework resting on six key concepts. The clarity of aim and the relevance of the proposed concepts are notable strengths. However, the content tends to be repetitive, especially with the restatement of the e-Government definition, and the exclusive reliance on a desktop inquiry limits the depth and breadth of the review. A more diverse research methodology and reduced redundancy could further enhance the paper's quality and relevance along with teh implications related to the advent of Artificial Intelligence. There are a number of simple typological errors that could be easily corrected.
