- 1. Whether the word discrimination in the title of the article is supported by relevant literature in the article in terms of the dimensions it defines and expresses;
- 2. The article mentions the strengths of different teachers in the literature review. Is there a causal relationship between this and their differential treatment?
- 3. Whether cross-cultural differences can be taken into account in the selection of the sample in the article in terms of quantity and representativeness;
- 4. Whether the questionnaire was pre-tested and whether details of the sample selection, questionnaire distribution, and collection were provided;
- 5. Whether the in-depth interviews during the mixed study considered the two types of questionnaire teachers on specific topics such as emotions and other factors in the depth of the digging.
