Some good theories and consider the potential association as an area for further research, but this article needs more scientific data and less theories as well as when discuss other references to describe them or at least list pertinent information instead of strictly listing then, especially when were the author's own hypotheses previously published. As for checking histamine levels, more data comparing histamine levels is needed as well as specification of if plasma histamine, serum histamine, whole blood histamine, 24 hour urine histamine or random urine histamine as well as potentially checking urine n-methyl-histamine (random and 24 hr). Note histamine is not exclusive to mast cells as also produced by basophils so may want to include basophils in report or other mast cell mediators (tryptase, chromogranin A that is also nonspecific, heparin / anti-Factor Xa, prostaglandin D2, 2,3-dinor-11-beta prostaglandin F2, leukotriene E4, etc).
