In many instances, sentences are not complete or the thought of the argument is not clear. In cooperation with the respective authors this language expert can then restate some sentences to ensure its readability and consistency of thought.

It might also be helpful to utilise more subheadings to make it easier to follow the argument. It will also assist the authors to work more systematically in presenting the argument.
