

Review of: "[Case Report] Clear Cell Carcinoma of the Ovary with Disseminated Intravascular Coagulation and Haemoperitoneum with Tumour Rupture"

The new manuscript is better than the first one. However, the authors should precisely point out that the bilateral resection of the ovaries is not the correct operation particularly if one of them or even both have undergone rupture in the peritoneal cavity. They should also point out that the rupture of the ovarian cyst means that microscopic peritoneal carcinomatosis is present. The definitive surgical approach must include total abdominal hysterectomy, total greater omentectomy, and appendectomy.
