The figures are appropriately presented, and the paper's overall structure reflects a carefully conducted study. However, some revisions are required before it can be accepted for publication in the Journal. In light of this, I recommend that the authors address the following points:

- 1. Authors should highlight the novelty and objective of their work very clearly in the introduction section.
- 2. Authors must add some other related references to their works.
- 3. Equation (1) must be reworded to become more compact. (the space before and after the + sign must be eliminated.)

Additionally, it is recommended that the current manuscript undergo polishing by a native English speaker or a professional language editing service. Although the paper is well-written overall, an extra-linguistic touch will ensure clarity and coherence.

In conclusion, this is a well-written paper with interesting results that merit publication. The research direction aligns well with the focus of the journal. However, there is room for improvement. Addressing the mentioned revisions will significantly enhance the manuscript's quality and increase its suitability for publication.
