

Review of: "Study of the Problems of Determining Public Opinion of the Israeli-Palestinian War in Social Networks"

This paper focuses on identifying, classifying, and analyzing public opinions, emotions, and attitudes expressed in social media comments during the Israeli-Palestinian conflict. It discusses recent research but lacks enough references to be fully persuasive.

In terms of the dataset, the paper briefly addresses its preparation but omits detailed explanations, which are essential for reproducibility. A clear outline of the dataset preparation process and standards is necessary.

The methods employed are somewhat independent and lack a clear structure, with insufficient explanation for their use. A comprehensive methodological framework is required. Key challenges include ensuring data authenticity to avoid manipulation by fake accounts or bots, addressing language complexities such as slang and sarcasm, and managing the computational load of processing large volumes of unstructured text. The study emphasizes the value of advanced analytical tools in understanding public sentiment, which can inform strategic decisions in marketing, politics, reputation management, and crisis response.
