Instead, use the term "proportion"; no information has been given on the sampling technique and the recruitment procedure. Please explain well how and where the participants were recruited, where the examinations were conducted, and also what the inclusion and exclusion criteria were.

Data collection procedures and tools: Describe the data that were collected using the questionnaire; "The data collection tool was adopted from the related literature and the World Health Organization (WHO)": please give some references for this;

DISCUSSION

I think that it is unnecessary to have too many small paragraphs. I suggest that you merge some paragraphs that bear the same idea or discuss the same result or objective.

Paragraph 4: "In my study": please avoid selfishness. It is better to say "in our study."

Don't you think that a relatively low prevalence of visual impairment found in a very high-risk population like welders can be due to the diagnostic tools you used to define visual impairment? It would be interesting to discuss your results according to the diagnostic tools you used.
