

## Review of: "Government Communication and Behavioral Change amidst COVID-19: Role of Awareness and Fear & Panic"

It's my immense pleasure to review the article entitled "Government Communication and Behavioral Change amidst COVID-19: Role of Awareness and Fear & Panic". The article presented an interesting topic with some statistical evidence. However, some of the observations are as follows.

- 1. The sample size (304) is not adequate to represent a country. The minimum sample size for a large or infinite population should be 384 or more.
- 2. Although all statistical methods have been stated in the methodology section, it would be better to include a subsection, "Statistical Analysis" to state all the statistical methods more precisely.
- 3. From the study, it is observed that 97% of the respondents are tertiary educated. It indicates that the research had been conducted on a specific group rather than including people from all other educationally qualified groups. In this case, the result of the study can be biased and may not represent the country.
- 4. In section 3.3, the value within the several brackets is missing; Example: BC().
- 5. Overall, the paper has presented its results with sufficient statistical evidence, and apart from the mentioned points, the overall quality of the article is good.

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
