- 1. The title doesn't meet your paper. In the paper, you introduced a model or framework but the title talks about reviewing literature and redefining the concepts of E-government
- 2. It seems you use a lot of keywords; these words seem to be additional:

Comprehensive, redefine, involvement, accountability, transparency, business, process

- 3. In the abstract section, what do you mean by "conceptual paper"? In conclusion section, you use both framework and model. please note that they are completely different.
- A model describes but doesn't explain. It's commonly used to describe, or even simplify, the process of translating research into practice. A framework describes (but doesn't explain) factors believed to influence an outcome
- A model is something used to represent or explain the operation and mechanism of something else. A conceptual model exists in one's mind.
- A framework is a way of representing the empirical relations between every aspect of inquiry when considered a scientific theory or research. It describes the general direction and the constraints of the theory or research.
- 4. In the background section, you should pay a little more attention to the background and review of previous works, and you can also provide some definitions of e-government that you think are wrong so that the importance of your research will be more clear. In addition, the literature review section can be integrated into the background section
- 5. In some places you have referenced studies that were done almost 20 years ago when you could have used more recent studies.
