

Review of: "Nigerian Youths' Perception of Privacy and their Self Disclosure on Social Media"

The choice of subject is very relevant and interesting. It seems wise to compare questionnaire responses and habits. The responses given to the questionnaires provide elements that allow us to have a more precise idea of young people's perceptions. However, the sample chosen for the content analysis should have been larger because it would seem that it was not sufficient to compare its habits with the responses. If the results are not reliable enough, the research carried out should be further investigated. I suggest expanding the number of accounts followed and the number of days. In addition, the sample should be chosen with more criteria, taking into account the type of behavior in social networks, gender, and age.

Several pieces of information regarding the method are missing. When (year and month) was the study carried out? What are the participant selection criteria? According to the answers given? Were age and gender taken into account? What are the reasons for choosing the two-week period? What was this period?

Concerning the bibliographic references, the most recent dates back to 2018, and the majority are more than ten years old. Taking into account that the world of social networks has evolved a lot in recent years, it would be appropriate to cite more recent articles or works.
