I appreciate the opportunity to review the manuscript.

In general terms, it is very well written and provides useful information to know firsthand the profitability and costs of meat production in the different districts analyzed.

The information is very valuable and understandable in economic and administrative terms, apparently, it follows a logical chronology of its analyses, but it fails to describe the sources of said analyzes (methodologies), the references where the equations and methodologies used are found, it would be It was very useful to mention the references of these equations.

Another point of great value for the scientific community would be if all these costs were standardized in dollars or cents, so that the scientific community could know the profitability and production costs in their local currency (it is a comment).

Making an exhaustive analysis of the statistical methodology, apparently the author does not comment on how each of the values in the equations were compared in the different districts, the author should be more explicit in this, as well as the software used for multiple comparisons and determining the estimates in the equation that uses logarithms.

In the tables, the numbers within the parentheses do not show whether they are percentages or standard errors.

Finally, the discussion falls very short, since it does not make any in-depth comparison and discussion of the findings with other research in the area in other countries or methodologies or why these results occur.
