- A grammar checking is recommended, I suggest that the manuscript be proofread by a native English speaker or Editing service. So please make sure there are no English errors.
- 2. For Abbreviations, please first write the full forms. For example, GYO, SOC, CEEDAR and others. Please check all cases similar.
- 3. The title of introduction or background part of the study was missed. So your research should include it, unless it would confusable?
- 4. The study's objectives need more elaboration at the end of the introduction part? Just before you proceed to the statement of the problem or significance of the study section.
- 5. The literature review needs to shed light on theoretical underpinnings and experimental backgrounds. Please also identify the gap/novelty of your study.
- 6. Sampling is not clear. Please elaborate on how the author selected the participants of 30. I mean the sampling system employed to selected participants in the study?
- 7. You didn't talk about the novelty of your study. At the end of the literature review, the readers are expected to see why your study was conducted.
- 8. What is your research design? Is it descriptive or purposive or what? Why?
- 9. The abstract part of the study lacks clarity and completion; it did not well stated about the study, methodology, findings and its merit?
- 10. All employed documents in the reference are not APA style?
- 11. If possible add more key words.
