

# Review of: "Economics Rationality in the World of Amartya Sen"

This is an interesting article on an important topic, correctly emphasising that for Sen it would be a mistake to try to separate the notion of economic rationality from wider ethical concerns. The author highlights Sen's capabilities approach. It is also noted that for Sen rationality means subjecting choices to reasoned scrutiny. The author outlines Sen's basic ideas about rationality, and extends them by bringing in the idea of commitments. While I think this is the right thing to do, the author needed to argue this idea in more detail and depth. In addition, I was puzzled over the part of the article that discussed child abuse which seemed out of place here. In addition, I think to improve the written style the paper needs a careful language edit.
