I do not know the journal to which it is to be submitted, but it may or may not be within scope (this would not be overly interesting to a rhinology-focused readership, for example). In my opinion, it could be improved by addressing the following:

- Polishing of English grammar/syntax/style.

- Using fewer, more selective, enlarged images rather than multiple thumbnails comprising the entire series.

- Highlight that there are few indications these days to perform the Reidel procedure, but in this case, debridement of the anterior table made that reasonable as part of initial management.

- Their statement of embryology of frontal sinus embryology/development is a bit inaccurate. It is well-reviewed here:
