I appreciate the opportunity to review the present work. I have some questions regarding the research:

- 1. The objective of this research and its justification are not clearly stated.
- 2. Why was BMI chosen over other variables that may be more representative of body fat or even cardiovascular risk, such as waist circumference, waist-to-hip ratio, or waist-to-height ratio?
- 3. Regarding glycosylated hemoglobin, it should be mentioned which type of kit was used and whether the result is standardized.
- 4. It is understood that hyperglycemia and hypertriglyceridemia are associated conditions due to the metabolism of these molecules. Other determinants such as insulin resistance and indices like the triglyceride/glucose ratio could potentially enhance the impact of the research.
- 5. Finally, due to the vague justification and objective of the study, I am unable to appreciate the potential impact of this research. The only redeeming aspect of this study is the sample size. However, without a clear objective and justification providing a basis and support for this research, that strength is lost.
