

## Review of: "Contrasting Construction and Business Projects: Implications for Project Management Techniques"

The topic of the article is interesting and, after being improved, it will meet the requirements for scientific publication. It is suggested to pay attention to and correct the following elements in the text:

- In the article, the author's considerations are presented without confirmation of this information in the literature. For
  example, the phrases: "Very little of this paper is based on hard research." Which studies were not cited? A review of
  a larger number of scientific publications in this field and proper citations should be included in the article.
- 2. The article discusses construction projects and business projects. However, the article does not provide a clear definition of either type of project. The example of a construction project suggests that it is an investment project. In contrast, business projects are defined as smaller projects that encompass other activities. I do not fully agree with this definition, as business projects can be very complex and last for several months or even years. Therefore, the article should clearly define construction projects and business projects, and cite relevant literature.
- 3. The article lacks a presentation of the research gap, research thesis, and research questions. There is no indication of why this analysis was undertaken and where the need for it comes from. At the same time, there is no description of the research process. What were its assumptions? Why were only four projects selected, including one construction project and three business projects? I propose to supplement these elements in the article to make the publication more readable and organized.

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
