The work is very interesting, detailed, clear and very well written. The topic it describes - I would say, about which it informs - is very important and relevant.

The thing that puzzles me is: what kind of study is it? is it a description of a state of the art? a delineation of the current state of the art, of the needs, and then a proposal of how the system could be improved through the introduction and protection of the ubuntu philosophy within the education system? It is not clear what the intent and goal of this study is. Perhaps it would be worth adding a section specifying what the purpose of the work is?

The authors at the end say: ".Drawing upon a range of scholarly sources, personal experiences of authors, and recommendations provided by teachers in select KwaZulu-Natal schools. The research provides suggestions to alleviate volatility within educational institutions." Perhaps it needs to be introduced a little earlier what the research is intended to do, what kind of methodology it uses? It's not very clear, it almost seems more like an outreach work otherwise? Only in the title they stated 'systematic review of reflection'. is this it? Systematic review have kind of different rules..
