The study is identified as an Scoping Review, which should have been identified in the title of the manuscript.

The aim of this study was to examines existing literature on mental health in the global fishing communities, namely,: a) dentify the breadth of mental health aspects in fisheries literature, b) establish the geographic focus of the fisheries mental health literature, and c) examine the factors responsible for the global disparity in fisheries mental health literature.

The introduction describe the rationale for the review in the contex of what is already know in the field of the fishing communities mental health and provides na explicit statement of the questions and objectives being addressed with reference to population, concept and context.
