The study is devoted to a current topic. The writing is simple, consistent, and easy to understand. However, researchers need to be more precise in their use of terms. ICT – information and communication technologies, that is, information technologies (technologies for working with information) using computer and communication equipment, software, and network technologies. But it is unlikely that all of the above are resources ("raw material" or source) of information technology. Essentially, these are resources that enable the implementation of ICT and the use of them. It's not the same. ICT governance and ICT resource management are not the same thing at all.

In my opinion, the Literature Review should report the results of previous studies to determine the place and relevance of the authors' research to the problem. Now the "Literature Review" is a description of the essence, not the results of previous studies.

Best practices for ICT resource planning do not reflect any specific features of ICT planning. These are traditional approaches to planning and controlling any resources. The article is essentially a set of very general recommendations. The names of the subsections do not always correspond to the content; for example, strategies are not presented in the ICT Resource Renewal Strategies.

The purpose of the study is not clear enough, so it is difficult to determine to what extent it was achieved.
