In the paper titled 'On the Origin of Aging by Means of Natural Selection,' the author introduces the concept of the origin of human aging. Providing a review of the theoretical aspects of aging, the author highlights the central theories of aging. The introduction and methodology are well-designed. In addition to investigating how aging is inextricably linked with reproductive success during the course of a human lifespan, the author provides evidence supporting the concept that natural selection does not inexorably decline due to waning fecundity throughout the reproductive lifespan. Instead, it changes in strength at various stages of life. I believe this paper is ready for acceptance for publication if several writing issues are addressed:

- 1. Reading the abstract, I could not identify the contribution of the author. The author should structure the abstract following steps, for example: problem early research contribution propose contribution conclusion.
- 2. The figures should display captions leading a reader to not refer to the text before understanding the figures.
- 3. If aging is not multifactorial, on what basis are the authors modeling aging? It needs more clarification.
