The manuscript uses a modeling approach to examine and identify the contribution of labor productivity changes to regional economic growth. The manuscript aims to identify, through scenario analysis, how productivity change trends within selected sectors have direct and spillover effects on regional growth, which is an interesting research topic. The paper's argumentation is clear and rigorous, and I believe it is a manuscript worthy of publication. Of course, before publication, the authors could need further revision to improve.

- 1. The measurement of spatial spillover effects on regional growth can also be carried out using methods such as spatial Markov chains, which the authors can mention in the literature review.
- 2. The authors can compare and analyze the findings of the Danish study with those of other countries or regions already available, explain the similarities and differences, and give an elaboration in the discussion.
- 3. Please express the core conclusions of this paper more concisely and clearly in the Conclusion.

I suggest that the manuscript be published after the revision is completed.
