As many others have commented you haven't quite got to the stage yet where the need for this work is justified or supported by the academic literature. Once you have completed a literature review you should reconsider your premise and explore some ways in which to conduct some research on that aspect of this topic. What you find out will provide a basis for your recommendations. An area of Chinese higher education that you might be interested to explore in more detail is the open university sector which provides a lot of vocational focused education.
