Dear authors,

I read your article with interest, I am convinced that the use of PRP in the treatment of bisphosphonate-induced osteonecrosis of the jaws may have potential in future studies and new treatments. However, I would like to point out some suggestions for your article:

- 1) I would dedicate a space to the pathogenesis of bisphosphonate-induced osteonecrosis to better frame the problem and preventative therapies in the introductory part.
- 2) Was a literature review conducted before the trial to choose this type of treatment? If yes, it has not been indicated and the flowchart for selecting the articles used has not been indicated.
- 3) Therapeutic alternatives to the use of PRP are not covered, how should it have more promising results compared to resective surgical practice?
- 4) How was the selection of patients made? An operational flowchart and clear inclusion and exclusion criteria are missing.
- 5) radiographic images for example of the results obtained are missing.
- 6) what results were obtained at the bone level? the evaluation criteria couldn't only be obtaining of intact mucosa, it would be useful to indicate how much percentage of healthy bone has been recovered thanks to the operation.
- 7) I would add other studies and bibliography to the discussion, making a comparison between the results obtained from your experimentation and the data present in the literature.

I would suggest reviewing the article with major revisions before publication.
