Similar to what some of my colleagues have said, the study is a good attempt at leveraging this methodology to analyze a complex topic, I do believe that it tends to oversimplify things and lacks theoretical framing. I would suggest reading more literature on it since researchers have done plenty of work on these two variables in Indonesia and around the world as well. The author doesn't necessarily have to stick to literature from Indonesia and can use work from other countries as a baseline inspiration as well.

It would be a good idea to design a clear and more structured theoretical frameworks, have a clear hypothesis or problem statement, and study objectives so that the reader can easily spot what the study is supposed to do. There also needs to be a separate section for discussion that goes beyond just explaining the analysis tables. In the conclusion as well, there should be more detailed remarks especially the policy implications need to be flushed out even more to make the analysis more robust.
