

Review of: "Psychiatric Diagnostic Classification System Based on New Forms of Parenting Practices: an Invite for a Rethink"

The topic in question is of great interest and never widely treated in the literature. I fully share the author's opinion on this matter and the importance of giving greater emphasis to the role of parenting in the diagnosis and treatment of children with psychiatric problems, also through coding of new classification systems. This would shift the attention from the child itself, often simply defined as "pathological" and only target of the diagnostic and therapeutic intervention to the whole context which could be "dysfunctional" and require a global take charge, without however, as the author reiterates, blaming the parental figures. The article is well structured, clear and linear, the title is congruous with the content, the abstract provides brief and concise information, the introduction presents an adequate general description of the topic, the various sub-chapters touch on the main points; however, it would be interesting to introduce the role of "extended" family contexts (presence of grandparents) and the role of attachment in linking parenting styles to the child's psychiatric disorders. In conclusion, the work is recommended for its publication with regards to this topic and its treatment.
