

Review of: "Mobile Phone Recycling and Stockpiling Behaviour in the UAE: A Gender and Age Study"

Although the topic is of major importance, yet the manuscript lacks many key issues.

It was more appropriate to focus on factors influencing the intention of mobile phone users to recycle their devices rather than gender differences.

It seems that the Theory of Planned Behaviour (TPB) was not properly applied by the author, as the key determinants of behavioral intention of the theory developed by Jazan were not reflected in the questionnaire used (it seems that the questionnaire does not reflect (TPB)).

(the key determinants of behavioral intention are behavioral attitude, subjective norms, and perceived behavioral control).

The manuscript lacks a theoretical framework and hypotheses for the determinants of recycling intent.

It was more appropriate to include the questionnaire in the manuscript (constructs, measurement items of the theories, and references that you relied upon).

In Figure 1, ten hypotheses are presented, but the results of their testing are not clear in the results.
