Moreover, the <u>literature gap</u> is not well-defined.

- p. 8, line 24, the citation (Colquitt et al., 2019) has a different year in references;
- the citation (D'Aveni, 2009) is absent in References;
- the citation (D'Aveni, Dagnino, Smith, 2009) is absent in References;
- the citation (D'Aveni, 1994) is absent in References.
