Review of: "Do Not Resuscitate Practices in ICU: A Descriptive Study"

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This is an interesting article highlighting significant cultural differences in practice. I did find some of the results a little difficult to follow. For example, it wasn't clear if some individuals with a DNAR did survive. I think it could have benefited more from positioning these results against accepted international guideline-driven practice. I found it interesting that there was a suggestion that decisions for DNAR could/should have been made prior to 24 hours after admission to the ICU. In many countries, if it were possible to make that decision early, then the patient would never have been admitted to the ICU.
