Thank you for the opportunity to read and engage with this interesting discussion of how fieldwork studies prompt further mobilities after graduation. The article is generally well-written and readable, and I enjoyed its premise very much - it is difficult to research the effects of university studies after graduation, and this research does exactly that.

My main area for suggested improvement is to encourage the author to do more to extrapolate the theoretical ideas more thoroughly, either via a Literature section or in the Theoretical background section. This latter section is very short and basically outlines the hypotheses. The focus of the research deserves a lengthier literature section which would discuss education and its efficacy. In short, these are fascinating and important matters which need to be more thoroughly elaborated and related to relevant literatures. There also needs to be a short section underneath hypothesis 3 – as there is for H1&2, which includes some reference to 'destination' characteristics and 'impacts'.

It is hoped that these comments will be helpful in allowing the author to develop this interesting article towards publication.
