- -It is recommended to remove the word antigenic in the title since it does not correspond to the article topic.
- 2. Introduction.
- -It is recommended to reframe the objective of the work. Example. An exploratory study of the situation of CPV-2 in cats in Mexico.
- -It is recommended to be more specific regarding the affection of the thymus and other tissues.
- -It is recommended to be more specific regarding clinical signs.

3. - Material and Methods

- -It is recommended at first to mention the total population of cats studied and then the number of sick cats.

 Include a table that shows the positivity results in the total population studied, in the sick population and in the healthy population, together with the CPV-2 variants, to establish which were the most frequent in all cats, sick cats and healthy cats and thus be able to make a discussion about these results.
- -Explain how and where were taken the sample swabs?
- -Explain what clinical criteria were applied for cats with gastroenteritis and healthy cats?

General comments of the article

- -It is an article that answered a simple question of whether CPV-2 circulates in cats in Mexico.
- -Authors demonstrated interesting results for Mexico.
- -The manuscript has a local and national impact.
- -The article is deficient in results, discussion, and conclusion.
