- 4. Anthropometric Measurements specially the MUAC and Shakir tape should be cited
- 5. The family type presented in the results should be categorized as single parent, nuclear and extended family type
- 6. The authors should provide us the figure representation prevalence of SAM cases of the MUAC measurement
- 7. The authors could better discussed the findings of the study and should highlight the strengths of the study.
