- Detail the sampling procedure, ensuring a clear representation of the population of interest while acknowledging any potential selection biases.
- Discuss the methods used to measure variables, ensuring they are reliable and valid for capturing the intended constructs.

Results:

- Organize the presentation of results in a more reader-friendly format, possibly using tables, figures, and subheadings
 to improve readability and navigation.
- Consider providing more context for the statistical analyses performed, including a brief explanation of the statistical tests used and their significance.
- Discuss the practical significance of statistically significant findings, especially when effect sizes are relatively small.

Discussion:



- Engage in a more comprehensive comparison of the study's findings with prior research to contextualize the results within the existing literature.
- Provide a deeper exploration of the theoretical implications of the results. Discuss how the findings contribute to our understanding of mental health in informal sectors and the broader implications for policy and practice.
- Address the limitations in greater detail, including potential sources of bias, omitted variables, and any assumptions
 that might affect the study's conclusions.
- Suggest avenues for future research that could address the limitations and gaps identified in the study.
