"Posterior-assisted cervical decompression is a 20-year-old technique that has been considered an excellent method for treating cervical foraminal decompression and is now also used for myelopathy. The surgery is well-performed but requires something to capture the doctors' interest in the case during discussion or a better introduction. It could be improved by presenting a different perspective, for example, by comparing it with full endoscopic procedures. I recommend a major revision before it is published."
