

Review of: ""Healing is having faith in Allah, the healer, and the medicine": An exploratory qualitative study of Islamicbased healing practices in Northern Ghana"

The article is well-written about Islamic-based healing practices in Ghana. However, as a reviewer, the following suggestions are made to improve the manuscript.

- 1. The authors have stated that traditional health practices are used all over the world, but most people do not know about this practice. The statement needs further elaboration.
- 2. The data were collected from a small number of healers and practitioners, which is not a good number to make a generalized statement and conclude.
- 3. The healers interviewed did not seem to be well versed in Islamic knowledge and theology.
- 4. The disease categories treated or diagnosed were not clearly mentioned.
- 5. How to diagnose a particular disease is not clearly mentioned.
- 6. No particular herbal medicine to cure a particular disease was mentioned and described in this manuscript.
- 7. As the Holy Book, the Quran, is Shifa (a cure) for all kinds of diseases and it is obligatory for all the believers/muslims to have knowledge of it and to cure their diseases through its recitation.
- 8. The grammatical mistakes must be properly and thoroughly checked.
- 9. Journal format style may be followed before final submission and acceptance.
- 10. Proper reference style must be followed.
