The article is well written and referenced, but the methodology is based only on the use of a survey directed at a group of children. The explanation of the methodology refers to the open and axial categorization and coding method as a supporting method to systematically analyze the data. However, the results obtained and the conclusions become quite obvious, not contributing knowledge to the subject. The need for urban planning to include outdoor play spaces for children, conveniently distributed in the different residential areas is a confirmed and indisputable fact.
