In my opinion adding the following ones, for which vaccination is recommended (if not mandatory) for HCWs, will be useful: hepatitis A, pertussis, tetanus and poliomyelitis. Authors could also include in table 1 the vaccination recommandations for healthcare personnel in Europe.
