

Review of: "How to Think and Frame Third Worldism with Illustrations from Iran-South Africa Diplomatic Relations, 2006-2019"

The article is an interesting analysis of Third Worldism based on extensive literature and a case study (the relationship between Iran and South Africa).

The Author selects four dimensions of Third Worldism with which he reviews the existing literature. But one dimension, the NIEO dimension, is analyzed in extensive terms.

Overall, the concept and the four dimensions of Third Worldism are investigated from different perspectives, and the relationships between the perspectives are highlighted by the Author. Moreover, the evolution of the concept since the fifties is well explained by linking it to the change in the international political and economic context of the last seventy years.

The case study is well analyzed by the Author. However, the case study is presented before the analysis of the concept and the four dimensions of Third Worldism. My suggestion is to reverse the order of presentation. The case study should be put after the presentation and discussion of the concept. Finally, the Conclusions section, which is missing in this version of the article, will discuss whether or how much the case study fits into the analysis of the concept and how the case study can help students of Third Worldism.
