Debajyoti Gangopadhyay's essay is very interesting and deals with a crucial theme for all countries and above all for those who have experienced colonialism and who today are confronted with the problems of reconciling and comparing tradition and modernity.

In particular, the cultural context from which the reflection starts is the eastern one of India and the Buddhist religion. The comparison and comparison are between these Eastern traditions and Western philosophy, physics and culture.

The analysis is very clear, conducted with scientific rigor and satisfactory from a methodological point of view; certainly original. The language is also fluent and clear. For the epistemological aspects under discussion, it can be placed in the field of the Sociology of Knowledge.

I will focus on some aspects that can help the Author to improve the quality of the essay:

1. It would be advisable to insert a connection between the various paragraphs so that the parts are better connected and the essay is more harmonious.
2. The part in which the results of the research are presented through the statistical and graphical analysis of the results lacks an introduction. Therefore it appears detached from the context of the essay. I recommend specifying who the subjects involved are, how many there are, etc.
3. It would be advisable to insert a comment and an analysis of the numerical data which explains the answers and motivates the research itself.

Thanks to the author for this reflection which adds value to the knowledge of the relationship between tradition and modernity in India.
