Without adequate references, the article's credibility is weakened, and it is less likely to be accepted for publication in reputable scientific journals.

To enhance the value of their work, the authors should carefully review the article and identify all instances where definitions or results are presented without attribution. For each of these instances, they should provide appropriate references that clearly indicate the source of the information. This will not only strengthen the article's credibility but also make it more informative for readers.

In addition to adding more references, the authors should also explicitly acknowledge the limitations of their study. This includes acknowledging the specific methodological limitations of the study, such as the use of secondary data or qualitative data from interviews. It also includes acknowledging the broader limitations of the study, such as the lack of a comprehensive assessment of the prevalence and impact of malnutrition in Rwanda. By openly addressing the limitations of their work, the authors demonstrate their honesty and transparency, which will further enhance the credibility of the article.
