This article provides an overview of the science/values debate and argues that incorporating moral and other non-epistemic values into biomedicine may have some unintended, adverse practical consequences for researchers and clinicians and patients. This is an important point to make that merits further investigation. Most of the critiques of incorporating non-epistemic values into science focus on the epistemic adverse effects that can happen, such as bias, data fabrication, etc. This useful contribution that this article makes is that it speculates about non-epistemic adverse impacts.
