Positive Aspects:

- Distinguishing between long-run and short-run effects enriches the understanding of economic dynamics.

Areas for Improvement:

- Provide more detailed breakdowns in figures and tables to enhance comprehension.
- Expand on the justification for lag selection in the ARDL model to reinforce its appropriateness.
- Discuss potential implications of normality test results and assess robustness accordingly.
- Provide a more in-depth discussion on the implications of stability test results for result reliability.
- Strengthen the link between results and practical policy implications for a more actionable conclusion.
- Clarify the directionality of observed relationships to enhance the depth of result interpretation.

Limitations:

- Introduce a limitations section to acknowledge potential constraints or assumptions in the analysis.
- Ensure consistent use of terms throughout the manuscript for clarity.
- Double-check formatting and ensure consistent and correct citation application.
- The study could benefit from a more explicit acknowledgment of the scope limitations, outlining the boundaries of the analysis.
- Consider addressing any data limitations explicitly, acknowledging potential gaps or constraints in the dataset used.
- Emphasize that findings may be context-specific and caution against overgeneralization.
