Very interesting approach, impressing vocabulary and thorough empirical analysis.

- 1. The Abstract is not specific enough, therefore it needs to be re-structured. Especially the last period is very puzzling => please rephrase. Also, when an abbreviation is provided, particularly into the abstract, it shall be explained the first time it appears to the text (SEI).
- 2. The Introduction is fragmented and brief. Also, here SEI does not need to be written in full. In addition to that, the definition given is quite poor. The last sentence of the first paragraph must be rephrased to make sense. Further, ISEI requires an explanation.
- 3. "in the context of perceived financial stability" does not seem like an adequate expression.
- 4. In The Literature on Social Entrepreneurship, you are expected to give a brief description for HEI. TPB does not need brackets. You missed a word f..... in the 12th line.
- 5. In "The social entrepreneurial aim model proposed by Hockerts" you can either refer to social entrepreneurial intention or SEI. Further, social entrepreneurial self-efficacy asks for a definition.
- 6. By "Perceived financial security" do you mean stability/sustainability?
- 7. Pay attention to the statute of limitations in the Discussion section. I can see 5 paragraphs to be formed.
- 8. The Conclusion is nice but brief. Hence, it needs to be extended to at least two more paragraphs.
- 9. Very few references.
- 10. I understand this is the journal policy to put numerical citations in brackets. However, when you refer to a specific source or writer(s) they shall be written in full no matter the numerical citation in brackets.

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
